The Gospel

The Gospel (continued from last week)

Liturgical Symbols Surrounding the Proclamation of the Gospel

The Liturgy loads the Gospel with various honorary signs to emphasise its primacy within the Liturgy of the Word.

The Gospel Book is given great honour. Solemnly it is carried aloft in the entrance procession, the Word of God leading us, a light to our path. It is laid on the Altar where it remains until the Priest or Deacon retrieves it and, accompanied by acolytes, proceeds ceremoniously to the lectern. We all stand, singing our Alleluias and welcoming Christ, the Word of God and Light of the World, who speaks to his people through the human voice.

It is an ancient tradition that only the priest or deacon proclaims the Gospel. The candles which led the procession flank him, emphasising the theme of light. Incenses is used, reminding us that the words we are about to hear are holy; a Reading from the Holy Gospel, he says. We all sign ourselves with that ancient form of the Sign of the Cross, made with thumb, on forehead, lips and breast, praying that the Word and Light of Christ may be in our mind, on our lips and in our heart. When the Priest has finished the proclamation, he kisses the Gospel Book, showing it all the reverence it deserves.

Christ's Gospel opens to us a new vision of what it really means to be human. What He proposes is wholly contrary to what we and society take for granted as being the normal way of living, and completely opposed to the gods we have created for ourselves. If you want to be rich, give your things away; if you want to be powerful, get down on your knees, wash the feet of the poor and be content with the lowest place of all; if you want to be truly clever, become a fool in the eyes of the world, so foolish as to believe that the one true God loved the world so much that He became Man, stretched out his arms on a Cross and died for us. This is the Gospel and it is only when we believe it wholeheartedly and rise courageously to its challenge that we find our horizons broadened immeasurably, discover we are made of sterner stuff than we first thought, and experience the true freedom of the children of God.
